

Hampton Falls Heritage Commission  
Draft Meeting Minutes  
March 2, 2015

Present were David French, Chair, Beverly Mutrie, Secretary, Wendy Harrington, Commissioner and Mary Ann Kasprzak, Selectwoman. Mary Ann Hill was absent.

The meeting commenced at 6:50 pm.

The minutes from January were discussed and passed upon a motion to amend the sentence to "...members can access all shared documents and photographs provided..." instead of "...members can read a posting provided.....", by D. French, seconded by B. Mutrie and all agreed. We did not meet in February due to snowstorm.

The balance in the Heritage fund held by the treasurer is \$5315.91.

We discussed the Heritage sign order which had the word "The" added to the top of the sign for 24 Kensington Road, a Dodge house built in 1917.

A small jar of white paint to paint out the letters as there are other more important Dodge houses in town. D. French made a motion to pay the bill and request the paint to Ould Colony Sign for \$62, with W. Harrington seconded. All agreed.

There is an April 17 State Wide Heritage conference that B. Mutrie and M. Hill would be willing to attend. The Heritage Commission voted to pay 1/2 the entrance fee/lunch.

D. French will ignore requests from Go Daddy for an alternative Domain Name. We are satisfied with HamptonFallsHeritage.org.

We discussed how to disseminate information on the Liberty Elms that the town will be purchasing in bulk once there are enough reservations. B. Mutrie will make a poster before voting day. M. Kasprzak will obtain information from the Town Administrator about costs, size, sending money etc. B. Mutrie will also draw up a printable order blank.

D. French announced that because of pressing family issues, he will be stepping down as Chairman after the vote in March. He will still stay on the board and try to find alternates.

Lynne Monroe has been receiving information on the Town Hall and Library and is still working on the application as far as we know.

Next meeting may be cancelled due to Easter holiday.
