Minutes of the September meeting were read and approved.

OLD BUSINESS:

F. Brown has spoken to D. Robinson and asked to scrape the roads in New West View this fall.

L. Marelli has mowed the new grass around the water spigot in Oak Lawn. The new grass came in nicely and looks good.

T. Healey-Beatty confirmed the order for the new sign for New West View.

T. Healey-Beatty reported that R. Russell has supplied a granite stone from his property and she has gotten two estimates for engraving. One from Newburyport Memorials for \$190.00 for two lines and one from R. Syphers Memorials for \$250.00 for two lines. F. Brown made a motion to have Newburyport Memorials do the engraving. Motion seconded by J. Bohm. T. Healey-Beatty to place the order.

J. Bohm attended the selectmen's meeting and they questioned the need for \$150.00 that we set aside for lunch each year for the prison workers since we have been unable to get their services the last several years.

J. Bohm reported that Stratham Hill Nurseries does not carry the Bradford Pear tree as they consider them to be fragile. Rolling Green Nursery in Greenland has a Chanticleer Pear which is very pretty and hearty. Also suggested was the Winter King Hawthorne. Trees will cost between \$200.00/\$300.00 each. It was felt by members that J. Fermery should be consulted before placing an order.

NEW BUSINESS:

The end of season bill was received from L. Marelli for mowing in 2014. \$9,225.00 was the final total. A motion was made by J. Bohm to pay said amount, seconded by T. Healey-Beatty.

While still in secession we received delivery of the new sign for New West View and a motion was made by J. Bohm to pay the bill of \$84.00, seconded by T. Healey-Beatty.
